McKinney Roughs Nature Center
State Trails Conference
October 10, 11 & 12, 2003**

This October will find the Texas Trails community gathering at beautiful McKinney Roughs (www.lcra.org/lands/roughs) near Austin for an enjoyable and enriching weekend all about trails.

This year's conference theme expands our traditional focus on design and construction of natural surface trails to include a good look at the important roles that trails play in our communities. There will be two tracks featuring eight concurrent sessions with a diverse lineup of topics and presenters. In addition to sessions addressing trail maintenance concepts and practical applications, a second track will address social aspects, health benefits, economic opportunities, and lifestyle dynamics associated with trails. This expanded range will appeal to urban planners, developers, realtors, landscape architects, community activists, and municipal leaders as well as trail planners, builders, and enthusiasts - so we expect to welcome a number of new folks to the fold.

Conference registration includes ALL THE FOLLOWING: eight concurrent sessions, a plenary session with keynote address by Vice-President of American Trails – Robert Searns, AICP, all meals and snacks, two nights accommodations in the dorms, the Texas Trail Mixer Social, silent auction*, live music, a hayride-style tour of the extensive McKinney Roughs trail system, and, oh yes, hands-on trail work.

***(We ask each attendee to bring an auction item representative of your agency, site, or region)**

Special activities (additional fee required) this year will include: full-moon night rafting on the Colorado River, a naturalist-led birding hike, access to non-public areas to view pre-historic archaeological sites, and a course in GPS mapping.

Space is limited - Overnight accommodations for the first 128 registrants. Mark your calendar now and plan to join us October 10th at McKinney Roughs as we renew old acquaintances and meet new friends with a common interest in trails.
